

# *Silent Submission*

A Short Devotion From Pastor Roberson

The Psalmist David wrote in Psalm 62, verse 1 (Amplified), "For God alone my soul waits in silence; from Him comes my salvation." And then in verse 5, "My soul, wait only upon God and silently submit to Him; for my hope and expectation are from Him".

We talk a lot about the importance praying in tongues plays in meditation, how it builds our spirits up with that "anointing that cannot lie", how it increases our understanding of the Word and discernment of spiritual things. But there is another important factor that I'd like to just quickly and briefly share with you.

That other factor is "waiting on God" as David is referring to in these passages. It is not a passive waiting where you carry on your activities and say "I'm waiting on God". It is an active waiting where you get alone with God in a quiet place.

I covet these quiet times. They have a way of sorting out your thoughts. They allow the Holy Spirit to impress His desires and thoughts on your mind.

Probably the greatest hindrance to meditation is the hustle-bustle life most people live, never taking time out to ponder the path they're on, to take stock of their lives, or to rightly evaluate whether their priorities are in order or not.

I encourage you to make a quiet time part of your regular schedule. Whenever you take the time, make sure nothing is demanding your attention so that your thoughts are free to just "explore".
